

Scott Stevenson. Scott received a Bachelor of Arts in Military and Strategic Studies from Royal Roads Military College in 1988, where he was also captain of the rugby team from 1986—88. The highlight of his rugby career was defeating RMC in March 1987. He received a Master of Public Administration from Queen's University in 1999. He is a former federal government Senior Assistant Deputy Minister (ADM). He currently does contract work as a Senior Mentor on the National Security Programme at the Canadian Forces College, and serves on the boards of two charities: Habitat for Humanity Greater Ottawa as board chair, and the Royal Military Colleges of Canada Alumni Association (RMCAA) as Chair of the Advocacy & Promotion Committee.

Scott joined the public service in 1999 at Finance Canada, following nearly 15 years of service as an infantry and intelligence officer in the Canadian Armed Forces. He joined the Department of National Defence as a director in the Policy Group in 2001 and was promoted to director general in 2005. From 2007-13, he was ADM Infrastructure and Environment at Defence.

From 2013-15 was Senior ADM Regional Operations at Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada. In 2015, he was a Senior Fellow at the University of Ottawa's Graduate School of Public and International Affairs, focusing on leadership and organizational transformation.

In 2016, he was a senior advisor on federal real property portfolios for national security and science. From 2017-2020, he was at Canada Lands Company as Visiting ADM Public Services and Procurement Canada – CLC Collaboration, leading projects to optimize value of under-utilized assets.

Scott was appointed to the RMC Foundation Board in 2019 and he became the Chair of the Audit Committee of the RMC Foundation in 2020, while also serving on the Gifting Committee.

Following the merger of the RMC Foundation and RMC Club in 2021 he was Chair of the Governance Committee and Audit Committee of the RMCAA, until 2022, when he assumed his current role.

Scott is married to France Hébert (RMC 1992) and proud father of Alexandre Stevenson (RMC 2023 – an Artillery Officer) and Isabella Stevenson (University College Cork, 2022 – a medical doctor).
